


## Worship in Revelation

Proclaiming the One Who Was, Who Is and Who Is To Come

- (1) God the Father's throne at the centre of heaven, around which is a rainbow like an emerald and from it comes flashes of lightning, rumblings and peals of thunder (4:2-3,5).
- (2) 7 torches of fire, which are the 7 spirits of God (4:5).
- (3) The conquering Jesus, announced as 'the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David' and appearing as a slain Lamb with 7 horns and 7 eyes, which are the 7 spirits of God. Jesus takes the 7-sealed scroll from God the Father on the throne [5:1-7].
- [4] The 24 elders sitting on thrones, dressed in white, wearing golden crowns and holding harps and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. The elders worship God, cast their crowns before his throne and sing a 'new song' praising the worthiness of Jesus to open the scroll (4:4, 10-11; 5:8-10, 14).



- (5-8) The 4 living creatures, each with 6 wings and full of eyes all around and within, holding harps and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. The living creatures perpetually praise the Creator God and sing a 'new song' praising the worthiness of Jesus to open the scroll (4:7-9; 5:8-10, 14).
- (5) The 1st living creature looks like a lion (4:7).
- **(6)** The 2nd living creature looks like an ox [4:7].
- (7) The 3rd living creature has the face of a man (4.7)
- (8) The 4th living creature looks like an eagle in flight (4:7).
- (9) 1000s of 1000s of angels praising the worthiness of Jesus (5:11-12).
- (10) Every creature in heaven and on earth, under the earth and in the sea, praising Jesus and God the Father (5:13).



Worship scenes in Revelation show the truth – there is only one power in the universe worthy of worship and awe

In the first century, the Roman Empire was immensely powerful.

It had conquered the known world.

It alone was powerful and rich with technological marvels like the Roman Roads and aqueducts.

It seemed good to the Greeks of Asia, in the opinion of the high priest Apollonius of Menophilus Azanitus: "Since Providence, which has ordered all things and is deeply interested in our life, has set in most perfect order by giving us Augustus, whom she filled with virtue that he might benefit humankind, sending him as a savior, both for us and for our descendants, that he might end war and arrange all things,

and since he, Caesar, by his appearance (excelled even our anticipations), surpassing all previous benefactors, and not even leaving to posterity any hope of surpassing what he has done, and since the birthday of the god Augustus was the beginning of the good news for the world that came by reason of him


(\*The *beginning of the good news* of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. (Mk 1:1)\*)

Honouring the Emperor and showing your 'faith' in emperor and empire were key parts of participating and showing loyalty and being a 'good citizen'

To refuse to participate when ordered to was punishable by death

For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.


They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat;

(Rom 12:1)




### The test of Roman faith

Worship in Revelation forces us to ask the question


Who will we put our faith (loyalty) in?
